



Drawing Your Line In Sand

Over the past few weeks, I have begun my sermons highlighting two of my favorite U.S. Presidents; George Washington and Abraham Lincoln. I deeply admire both men for looking beyond the moment of time they were currently in, and making the tough decisions that would positively impact our country for generations to come.



My third favorite president, however, is one that often falls under the cracks when it comes to the "greatest of all-time" president discussions, Ulysses S. Grant. Grant was a Civil War hero and abolitionist who fought tirelessly during the Reconstruction Era for the rights of newly freed African-Americans. Amidst push back from the congressmen of the both free and newly freed "slave states" Grant **drew his line in the sand**, ratifying the 15th amendment of the U.S. constitution giving African-Americans

the right to vote. Not only that, Grant also encouraged African-American political representation, with the first 16 African-Americans being elected to congress during his administration from 1869-1877. With his signing of the Civil Rights act of 1875, this was the first president to push through legislation that provided all citizens, regardless of color, the access to public accommodations, theaters, schools, churches, and cemeteries.

While considered extremely controversial in his day, Grant had the foresight and determination to help accomplish the goal set in our Constitution, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness. **Grant understood the liberation of people of color wasn't an option; it was the will of God. Grant famously stated that we as Americans should, "Hold fast to the Bible, as the sheet anchor of our liberties."**

Another famous figure in history who held a similar perspective was Daniel, a Jewish leader, whose story is recorded in the Old Testament of the Bible. Daniel understood that there are times we need to cleanse ourselves from the evils of this world and purify our thoughts, words and actions. Some of these decisions may cost us friends, family or even our livelihood. However, with the gift of the Holy Spirit, we are able to discern right from wrong and trust that God will provide for us and protect us in our times of need. In Part Three of our sermon series "**Drawing Your Line In Sand**" we continue our study on how Daniel, our main character, maintains his biblical integrity through his lifetime of Babylonian captivity. We can learn from Daniel on how to live a righteous life in a fallen world that wants to find every reason to persecute us.
