Stragglers Picked Off

Many people regard religion as something that doesn't benefit you until after death, and if that is the outlook, it can seem like there isn't anything important about living the "Christian life" at every minute. We might start to become content with "good enough." We may say to ourselves, "what's the harm if I miss a Sunday service? I go to most of them!" or even "I know I should be doing x,y, and z but (insert excuse) - I'll start doing those eventually." or even "well, I don't do all those things - I'm not on that level yet."



There is a saying that "just being 'good enough,' is never 'good enough'" that we can apply here, and the Bible gives us a great example of this in practice.

In **Deuteronomy 25:17-18** it reads ""Remember what Amalek did to you along the way when you came out from Egypt, how he met you along the way and attacked among you all the stragglers at your rear when you were faint and weary;" Wait... weren't those slow-moving Jews "heading the same direction" as everyone else? Weren't they "generally doing the same" as everyone else? They were going to get where everyone else was at "eventually." They thought their pace to the promised land was "good enough." Those who thought and acted this way were the people that were picked off by Amalek, a neighboring king and enemy to the Jews.

God promised protection to the Hebrew nation, and no one could overpower them when they were united in doing what God directed. Yet those who wanted to go at their own pace, who would "get there eventually," needed to be there already when trouble came! And they were destroyed because they weren't! How does Peter describe our adversary Satan? He states that he prowls around as a roaring lion, seeking whom he may devour. When lions attack, they never target the main herd of prey, they target the loners, the ones who fell behind - the stragglers!

If you have things to overcome in your faith, steps that you need to take with your walk with God, take them now! Our life is like a vapor, and we do not know what tomorrow will be like as James writes. Believe in God, repent of your sin, be baptized in the name of Christ, and live for Him, turning away from sin. It isn't too late - until it is too late. Don't fall behind on your Christian walk, keep pace with God! He will never leave you nor forsake you, but He will not "catch you up" if you **choose** to start lagging behind His expectations. God did not protect those who planned to do what He commanded "eventually" - He protected those who were doing it now! Don't be the straggler that is easy prey for the lion. Take those steps and remain at the side of our good shepherd.

- Karen Stanzione's son-in-law Jose Correia had his appointment on Thurs., Oct. 19th with his team of doctors and surgeon after taking a series of tests, the data shows he does not meet the criteria. It was suggested to Jose to reach out to the doctors that performed his previous surgery. The surgery will be complicated and has a 40 % survival rate for five years. 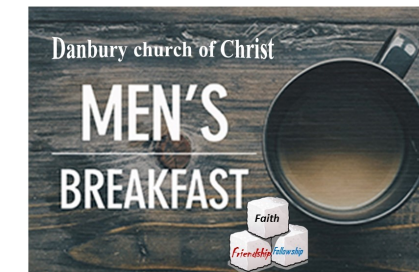
